

Curriculum Coverage Overview – Autumn Term 2 2017/2018

Year 1

English: Fiction: Fairy Tales

Through an exploration of Jack and the Beanstalk, Little Red Riding Hood and Hansel and Gretel, the children will compare and contrast different versions of the same story. Children will also practice using role-play to fully understand character and plot. They will work collaboratively to publish a new version of a well-known traditional tale.

Poetry: pattern and Rhyme

Children take part in skipping, chanting poems and compose their own verses to poems that include repetition and rhyme.

Non-fiction: recount

Children will write a recount about something exciting and memorable that has happened. Recount texts can come in the form of diary entries, newspaper articles and letters.

Science: Season's changes

Children will look at weather forecasts and video their own school weather forecasts, do weather observations and make collages about the seasons. They will also have fun with shadows as well as make a class weather station that can measure rainfall, wind direction and temperature.

PSHCE: Who am I? & communities

Children will explore and understand how they are similar and different from one another. They will understand the importance of respecting similarities and differences within the class and community.

PE: Gymnastics: using space

PE DAY: WEDNESDAY

Children will be exploring different ways of travelling, making shapes with their bodies and travelling at different speeds.

Art: Painting poppies

Children will explore different strokes, and painting techniques. Taking in the rich historical background, they will create a final piece of painting displaying poppies.



History: commemorating events beyond living memory

Children will learn about events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally; events commemorated through festivals or anniversaries, commemorative days such as Remembrance Day. Children reflect on their memories and understand the meaning of symbols, in particular the Remembrance Day poppy. They explore and discover the reasons behind Remembrance Day and how the event is marked around the world.

Maths: place value number addition and subtraction

In Maths, children will focus on the following this term:

- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 10
- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.
- Add and subtract one digit numbers to 10, including zero.
- Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations and missing number problems.
- Recognise and name common 2-D shapes, including: (for example, rectangles (including squares), circles and triangles)
- Recognise and name common 3-D shapes, including: (for example, cuboids (including cubes), pyramids and spheres.)

Islamic Studies: Fiqh

In Islamic Studies the children will learn the following: Basic introduction to five pillars of Islam, Shahadah, Salaah, Zakah, Saum & Hajj, introduction to tahaarah, keeping clean, how to use the toilet, why we do wudhu. method of wudhu, things that break wudhu, names of the 5 daily prayers & basic salaah positions.

Hadeeth: helping others.

Surah and Duaa Memorisation

Review surahs and duaas from Reception level. Learn Surah Kafirun and Surah Kauthar.

DUAS: when entering and exiting the toilet, dua after eating, dua if one forgets to recite the name of Allah before eating, 10 names of Allah.
